

- Experience












EDUCATION: XAVIER UNIVERSITY SCHOOL OF HEALTH SCIENCE

- ✓ An opportunity to experience operating a steamboat through the museums steamboat simulator.










EXPERIENCES: NEW ORLEANS PELICANS NBA GAME AND AUDUBON AQUARIUM


